Virtual Programme**

28th September Saturday: 9:00 am to 1:00 pm & 1: 30 to 5:30 pm (8 hrs)
29th September Sunday: 2:00 pm to 6:00 pm (4hrs)

On the occasion of the World Hospice and Palliative Care Day on 12th October 2024, CMAI is planning to conduct the 16 hours WHO Curriculum online for training Church and Allied Health Volunteers in Palliative Care.

Come and join us to help develop good understanding of palliative care and also get equipped with some skills to be an effective volunteer

Palliative Care is wholistic care, of people facing a 'life limiting' illness, to improve their quality of life and death and also to help their families to cope. Many of the problems in advanced diseases are of a 'nonmedical' nature. The community has a major role to play in addressing these problems. It is summarized in two great commandments as loving God with our whole being and loving our neighbour as ourselves. God wants us to be available for Him and be there for one another. We will thus be healing communities working to bring support and comfort to those who are suffering. This training will give you a good understanding of palliative care and also equip you with some skills to be effective as a volunteer. Due to the many deaths during the Covid-19 second wave, there is a big need for providing bereavement support, which this course will also address.

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The program will train lay persons from churches as well as Allied health care professionals, nursing and college students from various institutions using the 16 hour WHO Curriculum. Those who complete the course will receive a e-certificate from CMAI.
