# Emerging Trends in Allied Health Education

CMAI Being the pioneers in Health Care Education, we always look forward to the future now. Since 1927 with our first certificate program in Medical Laboratory Technician to the current 30 different allied health professional courses conducted in 60 different hospitals across India, under the aegis of CMAI Central Education Board, CMAI has always given importance to hands-on training and an extensive gold standard curriculum. Below are a few new trends we have to keep watch on.

**1. Interprofessional Education (IPE):** Collaborative practice is becoming increasingly important in healthcare. IPE focuses on preparing health professionals to work effectively in interdisciplinary teams. By learning alongside colleagues from different disciplines, students gain a better understanding of each other's roles and develop skills for collaborative patient care.

Educational programs emphasize the importance of continuing education and providing



resources for professionals to enhance their skills throughout their careers.

National Commission for Allied and Healthcare Professions to streamline the existing fragmented curriculums and methods and give utmost importance to hands-on training.

### Practical Steps for Greening Healthcare Facilities

#### ★ Energy Efficiency:

Upgrade to energy-efficient HVAC systems to save energy and improve indoor air quality. Invest in renewable energy sources like solar panels and wind energy to decrease reliance on non-renewable resources.

#### ★ Waste Management:

Adopt reduce, reuse, and recycle principles to minimise waste. Segregate waste at the source, recycle non-hazardous materials, and ensure the safe disposal of hazardous waste. Compost organic waste and use reusable medical supplies to lower environmental impact.

#### ★ Water Conservation:

Prioritise water conservation by installing low-flow faucets and toilets. Implement effec-

tive wastewater management and treatment practices to ensure safe discharge back into the environment.

#### ★ Sustainable Procurement:

Source eco-friendly medical supplies and partner with green-certified suppliers. Prioritise biodegradable materials and reduce the use of single-use plastics to minimise environmental impact.

#### Challenges and Solutions:

Despite the clear benefits, adopting sustainable practices in healthcare can be challenging. Financial constraints, lack of awareness, and regulatory hurdles often hamper progress. However, these challenges can be overcome with creative solutions. Seek funding through grants and partnerships and invest in education and training programmes for staff to raise awareness. Advocacy for supportive policies and regulations can also drive the adoption of sustainable practices.

As Christian healthcare professionals, we are uniquely positioned to lead by example in the fight against environmental degradation. By embracing sustainable practices, we not only improve the health of our patients and communities but also honour our Christian call to stewardship.

# REFRESHER COURSES, FELLOWSHIP IN NURSING MANAGEMENT, KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND VALUES

Each one of us have aged parents, relatives at home and family members with end stage diseases that are becoming more common even in middle aged people.

Families struggle to balance care for their loved ones and other responsibilities at work and family. Palliative care facilities and trained people to provide home care are inadequate to meet the growing demands. The B.Sc (N) syllabus has a module on palliative care nursing. Nurses League had initiated a Refresher course for Faculty on palliative care nursing based on this module and the online

sessions were completed in 2023.

The participants went in small batches for a comprehensive exposure to CMC Vellore in Jan and Feb 2024 and came back with touching stories of their experience. They were moved by the way the team provided holistic care for their patients. They carried with them a lot of learnings that will benefit their patients, and students. We hope these kind of short courses along with the practical experience will enhance the quality of care being provided to the patients and also nursing education in the institutions.

NL is in the process of rolling out another course by June on 'Fellowship in Nursing Management'. Nurse leaders are lead professionals at the frontline. They have the potential to help realize the vision to a transformed healthcare system of our country.

Therefore, there is a need to harness the confidence of Nurse Leaders in managing human resources, using technology, managing conflict, good communication skills and using emotional intelligence effectively. Studies have proved that effective leadership directly relates to retention and satisfaction of staff.

The purpose of this course is to enable caring and competent Nurse Leaders for hospitals in India, with the Knowledge, Skills and Values needed to ensure excellence and provide quality nursing care, even within the resource constraints of their hospitals.
